KATE'S STORY

Kate has an intellectual disability, a sexual abuse history and grew up in institutions. Her behaviours meant that many services would not work with her. When she came to CLA she was homeless.*

CLA was able to help Kate to find support to sustain tenancies to overcome her homelessness and teach her valuable life skills. We facilitated a relationship with legal aid and linked her to a service to begin addressing her health and literacy issues. This relationship increased her capacity in problem solving, self care and reduced her vulnerability to exploitation.
